	Malicious cyber security risks, threats to democracy and post-Covid economic recovery are just a few reasons why Australian best practices (ACSC's Cloud Assessment and Authorisation Framework, DTA's Hosting Certification Framework and AG's PSPF) are increasingly focusing on the risk to overseas controls of data. Combined with proposed legislative changes from the Department of Home Affairs, the protection and safeguarding of Critical Industries and Systems of National Significance is highlighting the implication that, when governments accept the transmission of data overseas, they are implicitly negating their ability to manage the ultimate risks.
